Ned came up with other details (like books and the wheelchair) Then we assembled them all and added the other touches. Ned scanned them in and sized the people down... and is going to put it all together. We are getting it done now, as the cover needs to get into our book distributor's (Baker and Taylor) catalog. I'm just in love with all these children.






